EXTRACT from a letter from Mr. H. B. Taylor, Manager of the Uganda Railway, to Mr. Butler. Dated 24th January, 1913.

+ + + +

Whilst I think of it I wish you would stir up the Crown Agents. We have been pressing for the new Cargo steamer and it is now being delivered at the Lake. I saw the first truck arrive on 20th at Kisumu. All arrangements have been made for quick working and the traffic had orders to rush the material up to the Lake which is being done when I get a line from the Marine Department that "Plans not yet received". I instructed my Office to cable home and get a reply "Plans of Eusoga Shipped per Carisbrook Castle arriving 23rd inst." These are not the exact words. Is this not too disgraceful? We will not get them for another 3 weeks. I would like to get behind the party who sat on these plans. I learn it is not the sole occasion: There is a note in the Jinja Railway report "Engine shed erection delayed plans not yet received." This engine shed I saw at site some weeks ago but no plans had then been received.
