Sir,

In reply to Mr. Read's letter of the 27th February last, No. 6348/1913, I am directed by the Board of Customs and Excise to acquaint you that they have interviewed five applicants who appeared to possess the necessary qualifications for the vacant posts in the East African Customs at Kilindini and Mombasa, and they recommend :-

Mr. Geoffrey George Minett, born 14th September 1886; entered this service 6th November 1903; he is married, but is prepared to make arrangements for keeping his family at home.

Mr. Geoffrey Walsh, born 12th July 1884; entered this service 5th April 1906; he is unmarried.

Each of these Officers has a good general knowledge of Customs work and is acquainted with testing, grading and with the Abel test of petroleum; but if the Secretary of State desires it arrangements will be made for them to acquire a wider experience in these matters as suggested in the second paragraph of the letter under reply.
