He is strongly recommended by Professor Harvey Littlejohn, ^{to} whose opinion we always attach great weight. He is classed by the Medical ^{Council} Department as especially suitable and is described as a man of very considerable scientific and medical attainments whose abilities should be utilised if possible on very special work.
