I am directed by Mr. Secretary Harcourt to inform you that, subject to your being passed as physically fit for service, he proposes to select you for probationary appointment as a Medical Officer in the East Africa Protectorate with salary at the rate of £400 per annum.

2. If you are confirmed in your appointment at the end of your period of probation, you will be placed on the incremental scale of salary approved for Medical Officers on the permanent establishment, viz. £400 per annum rising by annual increments of £20 to £500 per annum.

3. Free 1st class passages ~~are granted by the Govt.~~ will be provided to and from the Protectorate; and you will receive half salary during the voyage to Mombasa and full salary from the date of your arrival at that port. ~~Accommodation~~ is provided free of rent (but not of rates or similar outgoings), or an allowance is given in lieu.

4. You will be under the orders of the ~~Govt.~~ and the superior officers of the Medical Depar-

duties of the appointment will be those ordinarily performed by a Medical Officer, but it is to be understood that your services will be available for any duties upon which the Governor, in the interests of the public service, may think it desirable to employ you; and it will be within his discretion to station you wherever he may consider your services will be most useful.

5. If you are prepared to accept this offer, I am to request that you will present yourself for medical examination to one of the Medical Advisers to this Department, whose names are given on the enclosed letter. The letter should be left with the medical Adviser, who will send his report direct to this Department. You will be required to pay his professional fee of one guinea.

5. A memorandum showing the general conditions attached to appointments in the East Africa Protectorate and a copy of the leave and passage regulations for civil officers are enclosed, but you are to understand that you will also be subject to any regulations which may be hereafter introduced by or with the sanction of the Secretary of State. ~~A copy of the pension~~ <sup>Copies</sup> regulations and a copy of the Colonial Regulations are also enclosed.

6. If you decide to accept this offer, and are passed as physically fit for service, you will be required, before proceeding to the East Africa Protectorate, to go through a course of instruction at the London School of Tropical Medicine beginning on the

1st of May. Details as to this course will be sent to you later, but if you are unable to attend on the first day of the course, etc., etc., state in replying to this letter what is the earliest day on which you can arrange to go to the School. It is unnecessary, perhaps, to point out that your interests as a wife and mother and domestication as far as possible.

S. A. I am to request that you will inform me at your early convenience whether you wish to be selected for this appointment. You should at the same time furnish me with an address to which communications intended for your relatives or friends can be sent, in your absence from this country.
