



I am directed by the Secretary of State for the Colonies to inform

you that, subject to your being passed as physically fit for service, he proposes to
select you for probationary appointment as an Assistant District Commissioner

on 26/8/13 in the East Africa Protectorate or in Uganda, or as an Assistant Resident in
the Nyasaland Protectorate, with salary at the rate of £250 per annum,
allowances of £15 per month, and £100 per annum.

2. A memorandum showing the general objections attached to appointments
in these Protectorates and a copy of the Trade and Passage regulations for
civil officers are enclosed herewith, but you are to understand that you will be
subject to any regulations which may hereafter be introduced by or with the
consent of the Secretary of State. Your attention is invited to paragraph 10
of the former memorandum, as to the position of Government quarters.

3. The regulations as to pension and a copy of the Colonial Regulations are also

4. You are also to understand that you will be available for employ-

Surveying; A Particulars of the course are given in the enclosed memorandum, and I am to direct your attention especially to the condition mentioned in paragraph

- If you are prepared to accept the appointment on these conditions, you should present yourself to one of the medical advisers of this Department, whose names are given on the enclosed letter, for the purpose of being medically examined. The letter is to be left with him, and you will be required to pay him a fee of one guinea. He will send his report direct to this Department.
5. I am to request that you will state whether you accept this offer and, if so, that you will furnish me with the name and permanent address of a relative (stating his or her relationship to you) for reference in case of emergency.
