Sir,

With reference to your letter, No. 21639/1913, of the 4th instant, I am directed by the Postmaster General to state for the information of the Secretary of State for the Colonies, that the information in the possession of the Department as to the conditions of employment of Female Assistant Accountants and Female Postal Clerks and Telegraphists respectively in East Africa differs in certain particulars which are shown on the accompanying statement, and I am to enquire whether it is intended to convey that the conditions of employment do in fact vary as regards the particulars in question. It is necessary to advertize these vacancies in the Post Office Circular, and it is desirable in order to obviate unnecessary enquiries that where the conditions of employment are the same for both grades the fact should be made clear.

If quarters are given they will be of rent, but not of rates or other outgoings. If an allowance may be granted, this may be linked with a requirement to reside in a particular house or neighbourhood.

Postal Clerks & Telegraphists.

- (1) Partially furnished quarters will be provided.

- (2) The officers selected will be liable for service at such Post Offices in the East Africa and Uganda Protectorates as may be considered suitable by the Local Medical Authorities for the employment of a female staff.

Statement of certain conditions of service for
Female Officers in East Africa.

Assistant Accountants.

Leave will be granted at the end of 30 months' service. This leave would amount to rather over three months on pay in the case of an Officer whose services were being terminated. In the case of the officer returning to the Protectorate an additional three months' (approximately) or additional pay will be given; but in such case leave is only allowed under a guarantee to refund the amount received should the officer fail to resume service in the Protectorate.

If, at the end of the 30 months' service, together with such leave as will be due, it is decided not to renew the services of the Officer concerned, such officer will be subject to proof of satisfactory conduct and physical fitness to re-enter the Home Service, and she was receiving at the time of her departure without loss of rank and as soon as a suitable vacancy occurs.

Postal Clerks & Telegraphists.

(3) Leave will be granted at the end of 30 months' service, 2½ days leave for every month of service at Nairobi, British East Africa, 3 days' leave for every month of service at Kampala, Entebbe, Uganda. Double leave will be granted if returning for another tour of duty. Passages out and home do not count as leave.

(4)

Medical Attendance in the Protectorate will be provided free.

(5)

If at the end of three years' residence in British East Africa, it is decided not to continue the services of any established officer selected, they will be allowed, subject to proof of satisfactory conduct and physical fitness, to return to the Home Service, without loss of seniority, as soon as suitable vacancies occur, at the salary they were receiving at the time of their departure.
