In C.O. letter 20824/1912 of 19th July 1912 we were sent a copy of a booklet of information for Engineers of Uganda Railway Lake Steamer Service in which the salary of the boats is given as £100-£240 after eighteen months.

C.O. letter 3882/1913 of 7th February 1913 gives the salary of 2nd Engineers £200-10-£260 (we note the difference between the two) but in the revised copy of the booklet sent to us in C.O. letter 4013/1913 of 11th March 1913 (regarding provision of modified currency) the salary is given as £100-£240. I suppose the pamphlet should be altered to read as in C.O. letter 7th February and we will list our supply if you agree.
