Dear Sir,

We are in receipt of your letter of to-day's date, informing us that you have written to the Colonial Office exactly in the terms of the draft letter which you let us see. That draft appeared to us accurately to set out the position with regard to the underwriting of the capital of the proposed new company.

We have not the knowledge possessed by the Colonial Office and your Company of the difficulties of the country and therefore it is not our intention to make ourselves responsible for more than £40,000 of the underwriting, and later on, if further capital is required, and a further issue of shares cannot be arranged, we presume it will be necessary to have recourse to a debenture issue similar to the present one.
