Sir,

As I understand that your Consulting Engineer,
Mr. Maurice Wilson, has arrived in England from East
Africa, and will doubtess be reporting as to the result
of his investigations with regard to the proposed
construction of a deep-water Harbour at Kilindini, I

wenture to write to express the urgent necessity - as
far as the Steamship Companies engaged in the East
African trade are concerned - for the provision of
suitable wharfage at Kilindini.

My Company has two new large steamers (11,500 tons) nearing completion for this Service, and - in view of the rapid development of the East Africa Protectorate and of Uganda - we are hoping for an increased volume of traffic.

The proposed scheme which Mr. Maurice Wilson outlined before the Mombasa Chamber of Commerce in March last appears to be of a comprehensive nature and well-suited to the requirements of the Fort, but I

would respectfully urge upon his Majesty's Government the need for putting the matter in hand as soon as possible, and pressing on with the utmost despatch at least with the construction of the first four of the projected berths.

I would also venture to draw your attention to the fact that, in order to meet the increased demand for space in our ships, we have put on extra steamers from time to time, but owing to the inability of the Railway to bring down the cargo offering in time for shipment, some of our vessels have left with considerable vacant space. I hope the Government will take into serious consideration the great need for improved Railway facilities in East Africa for dealing with the existing traffic, and the necessity of providing for the future expansion which is on all hands predicted.
