## SHIPMENT OF PEDIGREE STOCK

Notice that a contract has been made between the S.A. port and the U.C. Line, which pedigree stock is shipped free of freight to S.A. ports including Lourenco Marques. Suggest Govt should be asked to extend arrangement to E.A. Alternatively enquire if C.Q. would be prepared to assist.

Mr B. Howley to Recd

The exact nature of the agreement between the S.A. Govt and the U.C. Line is not stated. It may only apply to the shipping of Government stock and not to stock of general owners.

It is very doubtful whether we could persuade the U.C. Co to make any such concession to us (although we are just conceding them the port as to non-unionisation of loading ports in the United Kingdom), and in any case, I suppose, such an agreement could in our case only apply to a case of pedigree stock shipped for Government purposes e.g. on the Government Farms in E.A.P.

In 1912 H. Zappel has already communicated with the U.C. Co on the subject, and they have told him that they are not in a position to carry out his suggestion.

Sir,

It is my intention to send into the Protectorate of British East Africa, 10 head of Pedigree stock. I notice from the regulations in reference to South Africa that a contract has been made between the South African Government and the Union Castle Line, by which Pedigree stock is shipped free of freight to South African ports, inclusive of Lourenco Marques.

I approached the Union Castle Line to see if similar facilities could be offered by them for sending Pedigree stock to British East Africa, but I am advised that they are not in a position to do this. Might I suggest in view of the urgent need there is in British East Africa to improve the stock of the country that an earnest endeavour be made to induce the Union Castle Line to also extend this privilege to British East Africa?

Alternatively, might I enquire if the Colonial office would be prepared to assist breeders in the way of freight who intend to send pedigree stock to British East Africa?


