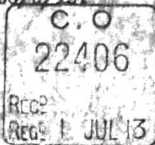

Gentlemen,

A customer of ours is home just now from Nairobi, where he has an extensive dairy farm with some 300 native cows. It is his intention to take out some pure bred Ayrshires, and, much to our astonishment, he informs us that the Union Castle Line make a charge of £24 for each animal, from the port of embarkation to Mombasa, and that the Government make no payment towards freight. Is this so? Why South Africa should have the benefit of cattle - free from disease and tuberculosis - being landed free, and B.E.A. not enjoy the same privilege, appears beyond us, and for that reason we await the courtesy of your reply.

Our customer's name is Watson, and his farm extends to about 2,000 acres and is within $4\frac{1}{2}$ miles of Nairobi.
