With reference to your despatch No. 946 of November 6th, I have the honour to inform you that I agree that the pay and allowances for Captain Kempthorne should be on the scales proposed by you in paragraph 5 and not at the consolidated rate.

2. There will not be any necessity to make provision in the Estimates for 1914-15 for overlapping pay pending the absorption of Captain Williams and Captain Cooke in their corps as there will be savings on the Personal Emoluments of the Survey Department Vote to cover this.

3. As regards your enquiry in paragraph 3 respecting a complete survey of the Mumias and Sekerr Squares including the portions which lie on the Uganda side of the boundary, the Director of Surveys informs me that it is not intended to make a further survey over the Sekerr sheet as a map has already been compiled of that portion of the country and is now being printed. It will, however, be possible to complete the mapping of the Uganda portion of the Mumias Sheet on the scale
