Sir,

I have the honour to confirm my telegram of the 29th of December which read as follows:-

"Young applies for vacant judgeship."

I desire to explain that this telegram was sent at Mr Young's request and at his personal expense.

2. I have now discussed the subject of the vacancy in the judiciary with the Chief Justice and I submit the following proposals for your consideration.

3. I recommend that the post of First Puisne Judge be offered to Mr Justice Bonham Carter, Second Puisne Judge. I consider that this step is one which, in view of his length of service, he may properly expect.

4. I recommend that the vacancy thus created of Second Puisne Judge be offered to Mr E.B. Logan, Town Magistrate. Mr Logan has now served in his present capacity for over eight years, during which time he has shown himself

himself to be a hard worker, painstaking and scrupulously conscientious with his cases, and a generally sound lawyer. I consider that he is fully entitled to promotion and that he would prove a capable Judge.

I am directed by Mr. Secretary Harcourt to

inform you that, subject to your having passed as physically fit for  
service, the proposed ~~appointment~~

recommend you to His Majesty for an appointment as  
2<sup>nd</sup> Class Judge in the Est. with salary at the rate of £700 p.a.  
and a duty allowance of £70 p.a. Such  
allowance is a non-pensionable emolument and is  
only drawn while the officer is actually in the Est. and  
performing the duties of his appointment. Free post class passages  
are awarded to and from the Port of Quarters free of rank that  
is not a rate or other similar outgoings, are made by the Est. and  
under any memorandum showing the general conditions attached to

appointments in the Protectorate and a copy of the laws and passing  
regulations for civil officers are enclosed herewith, but you are to understand  
that you will be subject to any regulations which may hereafter be introduced  
by or with the sanction of the Secretary of State. A copy of the regulations  
as to pensions and a copy of the Colonial Regulations are also enclosed.

3. If you are prepared to accept the appointment on these  
conditions, you should present yourself to ~~the~~ the medical adviser ~~to~~  
this Department, whose name ~~is~~ <sup>is</sup> given on the enclosed letter, for the  
purpose of being medically examined. The letter is to be left with him,  
and you will be required to pay him a fee of one guinea. ~~He~~ <sup>he</sup> will send his  
report direct to this Department.
