I have the pleasure to inform you that the temporary appointment of Miss Grindall as Telephone Operator, Nairobi, Kenya Colony, from October 1912, has now expired. In view of the service rendered by her during the period of her temporary appointment, and the question of her leave and passage to England arises.

1. The terms of her appointment, as set out in the despatch of Miss Annie Parker, which I enclose to you in a separate despatch, provide for her leave and passage on completion of her appointment to be at the expense of the Government.

2. It is, however, a matter for consideration whether a passage to England after the usual tour of service in the case of locally engaged Europeans in the Post Office Department whose work and conduct have given satisfaction.

3. The Postmaster General reports that Miss Grindall has rendered useful service as a Telephone Operator, and I have, therefore, approved of the grant to her of a passage to England on completion of 12 months service, and I trust you will accord

5. It is not intended that Miss Grindall should be re-engaged for a further tour of service, as the Medical Officer at Kampala, where she is now serving, has advised that she is unsuited for service in this country. She will, therefore, not be eligible for return leave.
