I have the honour to inform you that Miss Annie Grindall, Telephone Operator, appointed by me dated October 1911, has now complete 20 months service, during which time she has given good service, and the question of her leave and passage to England arises.

2. The terms of her appointment, as far as I know, to the post of Miss Annie Barker, should be sent to you in a separate despatch, and I will add that she has been granted a passage of return to England on completion of her appointment, and I trust you will accord her this offer of her services.

3. It is, however, my desire to concede less than a passage to England after the usual tour of service in the case of locally engaged Europeans in the Post Office Department whose work and conduct have given satisfaction.

4. The Postmaster General reports that Miss Grindall has rendered useful service as a Telephone Operator, and I have, therefore, approved of the grant to her of a passage to England on completion of 20 months service, and I trust you will accord
