In reply to your despatch Confidential of the 13th of November, I have the honour to inform you that the General Manager agrees that the scale of salary for Sanitary Inspectors in the Railway and Medical Departments should be identical, i.e. £200 by annual increments of £10 to £200 per annum, but does not wish these men to be taken out of their duties are not of a purely technical nature.

2. Mr. Taylor states that the requirements who are accustomed to manage Indians and natives and are acquainted with the habits and the native vernaculars are necessary for the technical work in the railway. The General Manager has settled the Railway Sanitary Inspectors first to supervise the large gauge engine and steam locomotive handling which are employed at all the main centres of the Railway and require efficient control.
