The Government of the East Africa Protectorate

To the Secretary of State for the Colonies

(Received Colonial Office 5.42 p.m. 29th January 1918)

No. 21. I have received telegram from Sorensen that Lieutenant Bentinck, 3rd Battalion King's African Rifles, has been dangerously wounded in a skirmish with the Her Tulhar section of Herenien. Please inform Mother, Countess Bentinck, 42 Green Street, Park Lane. Further casualties were one native officer and two privates severely wounded. Will report further on receipt of details.
