Sir,

I have the honour to report that I have recently received a communication from the Principal Medical Officer on the subject of the Native Civil Hospital, Nairobi, from which it is evident that certain additional accommodation is imperative.

2. The room which is at present used as an operating theatre is practically devoid of the necessary equipment and aseptic conditions are so difficult to obtain that even the simplest operation is fraught with danger. In fact, the Medical Officer in charge describes it as "a death-trap".

3. In consequence, the building has been closed for any but the most urgent surgical cases and even these can obviously only be taken with the greatest risk. The Principal Medical Officer has, therefore, concluded the advisability of abandoning it altogether and erecting a new hospital on another site.

4. For reasons it is to which I need not enter at present,

present, this scheme has been found to be impracticable. In the meantime, however, immediate improvement in the existing conditions is necessary and I have, therefore, sanctioned the reallocation of the sum of £750 from Item 2, Public Works Extraordinary "Draining of Bazaar £2,500". With this sum an operating theatre will be constructed and the balance, if any, will be utilized to provide additional accommodation for patients.

5. In the draft estimates for the coming year a sum of £4,000 has been inserted for the commencement of a new Native and Asiatic Hospital, Maironi. This building cannot however be completed for some two or three years and I have therefore been compelled to take this action as it was in my opinion impossible to allow the existing state of affairs to continue.
