The Land Office informed him that he could get a copy of the map from the Surveyor General's Office. The Surveyor General's Office will issue him a copy of the map.

Mr. Randall: I am satisfied with the country I can we get there. The Land Officer has already surveyed

Mr. Judds: Has anyone been to look at the land - damaged?

L.O. Uncertain - probably 6 acres a year. The trees would be moved, first.

I have the honour to acknowledge the receipt  
of your confidential despatch of the 7th of January  
regarding Dr. Forbes' application for land at Bai-  
kipia, and with reference to the 4th paragraph  
thereof to inform you that Mr. Barton Wright is of  
opinion that Dr. Forbes was misled by Mr. Randall  
into believing that he would be allotted a farm on  
application, but that he cannot avail himself of a per-  
mit of the Government to do so. I have no evidence to  
that end which I can show to the Land Office which could  
have justified Mr. Randall's misleading statement.
