February 21st, 1914.

Sir.

I have the honour to inform you that the following telegram was despatched to the Admiral and Commander-in-Chief, Simonstown, on the 16th instant and to express my regret that I inadvertently omitted to refer to it in my Confidential despatch No. 30 of February 20th:-

"Have received your telegram of the 14th instant. Arrangements have been made to despatch four Companies of Kative Troops to Kis ... ayu inmediately as serious situation has arisen up the Juba. It is not likely that operations will be undertaken necessitating naval assistance but an excellent moral effect would be produced by

the presence on our Coast of a Man-of-War."

2. As the Governor is due back in Mairobi on the 25th instant and will probably wish to see both Colonel Ward and Captain Salkeld. I am asking the Commander of H.M.S. "Pegasus" to remain at Mombasa till the 28th and then convey to Kismayu the Officers and men referred to in my telegram to him of February 18th.
