I have the honour to state that I have compared the copy of the "Notes for officers appointed to East Africa and Uganda" as amended by the Acting Principal Medical Officer, Uganda, with the suggested alterations and additions submitted by me under cover of my No. 38/314/3 of the 29th. January 1914.

2. The suggested addition on page 51 of the former is equally applicable to East Africa; it can, therefore, be written "In East Africa and Uganda etc."

3. The Uganda Amendment on page 66 regarding the administration of quinine in convalescence differs somewhat from that suggested in my letter for insertion on page 67. I, personally, prefer my proposed addition as, I consider that it provides more generally for the position. Any seeming contradiction between the two versions can be done away with by omitting the portion of the Uganda amendment beginning "Then give five grains" and ending "for a month".

4. The Uganda Amendment on page 68 regarding the removal of persons suffering from Blackwater Fever makes mention of certain conditions under which such a step may be permissible. I do not consider them unreasonable and would, therefore, suggest that my amendment might be inserted after these conditions, modified as follows, viz:- "It is a cardinal rule, however, that, when possible, the medical man should go to the patient rather than that the sick man should be carried to the doctor".

5. I have no remarks to offer in regard to the remaining Uganda suggested amendments except that I consider them excellent. They do not clash with any made by this office, I note.

6. I would take advantage of the present opportunity to observe that, as the word "Diarrhaea" commencing the sentence "Diarrhaea from any cause etc.," on page 67 is the commencement of a note on a fresh subject, the word "diarrhaea" should be printed in heavy letters like the other headings.

7. I would also mention, with reference to paragraph 2 of your despatch No.128 of the 5th. February 1914, addressed to His Majesty's Secretary of State that I should like the whole of the contents of the Circulars and Pamphlet submitted with my No.39/314/3 of the 29th ultimo to be included in the new edition of the "Notes for Officers".

8. I return the "Notes" herewith and would respectfully suggest the advantage of collaboration being permitted between the offices of the Principal
