With reference to your Confidential despatch of the 23rd of October, 1913, I have the honour to recommend that the post of Head Printer in the Government Press be made a first class appointment.

2. In Mr Bowring's Confidential despatch No. 128 of the 23rd of September he pointed out the increasing responsibility attached to the post, which can only be efficiently filled by a man who has undergone a long period of apprenticeship, and is in fact a specialist in his profession.

3. Under the superintendence of Mr E.W.Trim, the Government Press has become an institution of considerable importance, and the inclusion of the Head Printer's post amongst first class appointments is, I consider, perfectly justifiable.

4. I understand that this principle has already been admitted in the case of the Head Printers, both in Nyasaland and Uganda, although in neither of those Protectorates is the Government Press
