Sir,

I have the honour to refer to the provision for four additional Veterinary Officers made in Vote 22, Sub-head K, of the Draft Estimates for 1914-15.

2. The transfer of Mr. F. R. Brant to Algeria has now increased the number of vacancies in the ranks of Veterinary Officers to five as the Chief Veterinary Officer intends to recommend a member of the existing Staff for the post of Deputy Chief Veterinary Officer. Of these appointments Mr. Sturdy asks that one should be offered to Mr. Rupert Hart, of the Veterinary Department, North-Eastern Rhodesia. Mr. Hart has had considerable experience in Tropical Veterinary Medicine and as he was for two months residing at Kabete Laboratory near Nairobi he is well aware of the conditions and requirements of service in this Protectorate.

3. The Chief Veterinary Officer also recommends that one of the vacancies be offered to Mr. J. G. Bradshaw, now serving in the Veterinary Department of the Mozambique Company, Beira. This gentleman has
