I have the honour to refer to your despatch No.743 of November 3th 1912 and previous correspondence respecting the expenditure of the proceeds arising from the sale of Kisii captured stock and to enclose a copy of a letter received from the Provincial Commissioner, Nyanza, asking for sanction to spend Rs.10,200 on necessary repairs to the Homa-Kisii road.

2. It appears that a certain amount of money is still coming in from deferred payments by Europeans, there are savings on some of the works already approved and the sum of Rs.6,000 allotted to the Assistant District Commissioner's house at Kisii, which you were unable

unable to allow, is also available. Funds can therefore be found for the purpose stated by Mr. Ainsworth and I have provisionally sanctioned the expenditure asked for.

I should be grateful for your sanction or approval in each case without further special reference to yourself.

Sir,

Roads and communications.

Re Noma Bay - Kisii Road.

I have the honour to inform you that the principal bridge which is situated three miles along the road from Noma Bay has collapsed, resulting in the total suspension of cart traffic from the interior to the Port. In the interests of the trade of South Kavirondo, it is of considerable importance that the bridge should be rebuilt without delay. There are also other bridges and culverts on this road which require urgent attention.

2. The Asst. Executive Engineer, Public Works Department, has estimated that a sum of Rs. 10,200 is necessary for the execution of the necessary works.

3. The sum estimated by the Public Works Department can be found from the Kisii Captured Stock Account without interference with the other schemes sanctioned on this account. On the 31st October there remained a balance on the Kisii Captured Stock Account of Rs. 22,805, from which there

there will require to be deducted a sum of about Rs.39,000 to meet expenditure on account of the Agricultural Scheme already sanctioned, and to meet the cost of Sandu bridge also sanctioned. The Rs.10,200 estimated can, therefore, be found and I would ask that I be authorised to arrange for the work to be undertaken. The work of construction of these roads from the Gulf to Kisii formed part of the general scheme for ~~expenditure of the Kisii Captured Stock money:~~ so this request is only a continuation of that scheme.
