Dear Dr. Horn,

In reply to your letter of yesterday's date, we always receive officers of the Colonial Office suffering from any form of tropical disease, in the Branch Hospital. The fee varies from £8.2.0 a week in the Small Top Ward where there are six beds, and £5.3.0 a week for a private room: but, in cases where men are unable to pay even these small fees, reductions will be made on their representation from the Colonial Office.
