I saw Mr. Krush on Friday 26th June.

He told me that the Vacuum Oil Co.  
Wish me to remember of carrying out

carrying out a witness (if necessary)

A | Ask the person to take charge of him.  
This is not a "fugitive offender" but an  
"extradition" case - it is not us because  
but the masters of the Russian Govt.  
who have requested his surrender  
to send an officer to take charge  
of him - I find nothing in the  
Treaty authorizing us to carry him  
to my hand and turn over here  
[cf 140 memo 3/xx]

In sending the copy of 6/30 say that  
we presume that the Russian Govt.  
will make the necessary arrangements  
for "A" supra, and also (?) that as  
under Art xvi of the Treaty with Russia  
the demandant state pays all  
the expenses connected with the  
extradition we presume that  
Russia will reimburse the  
Vacuum Oil Co. the expenses  
of sending out the identifying  
witness.
