and to inform you that the Messrs Kealy Sons and Kerutt Govt of the P.A.P. state, in reply to a telegram sent to him at your request, that

Dechmann has made no confession, that he is being represented by a pleader in all proceedings and that his probable attitude will be that he is not the person wanted.

The Governor adds that if the case is to be successful, it is imperative in his opinion that some person should be sent to identify the prisoner.
