(2) The total period spent
in the East not to exceed
six months, and see
Annex

(3) Free local transport
in accordance with the
P.A. regulations.

(4) The necessary camp
equipment to be provided
by the Government.

(5) Free first class berths
to be provided by the Govt
for the journey from England
to Membrasa from
Membrasa to England
via the Suez Canal.

(6) No further fees to be paid

(of no value to Govt
of gift - trespass)

to you for your report, and
advise to be given by you
with out payment on any
written account out of your
visit & report within six
months of your return to
this country on the completion
of the reconnaissance. 550

2. With regard to the
question of detaching a remainder
of the Survey Dept to accompany
you, I am to say that the
Govt is unable to arrange to
send effect to this suggestion, but he proposes
to detach Lieut. J. F. I.
at Hill, Assistant District
Commr., N. F. I. for this
purpose, who (it appears)
is sufficiently qualified
for the work described by you.
