Since the original 1913-14 Estimates were settled the Traffic Dept. Staff has increased by

and 1 Ass't. T. manager for the Nairobi Railway. This post is at present filled by a Traffic Sub-inspector (Wilson) on probation. The 1913-14 Estimate showed an increase of 1 Asst. T. manager. He left therefore has not been started, but it is certain that there has been a great increase of work and that - as the Governor says - the way in which it has been carried out has been much criticised.

Sir,

I have the honour to report that the General Manager of the Uganda Railway has recently addressed me on the subject of an increase in the cadre of the Traffic Department.

2. The Staff for whom provision exists in the current year's Estimates is as follows:-

It will be seen from these figures that the absence from duty of any member of the present staff through leave, sickness, or from any other cause renders the Department understaffed and consequently inefficient. To deal with the traffic a permanent staff of 8 officers is required, and I am of opinion that it is desirable to provide for reliefs in order that this staff may never fall below the number which experience has shown to be necessary. You are moreover aware of the strictures which from time to time have been brought against the Railway Administration by reason of the delays experienced in the handling of goods and I have recently had occasion to transmit to you a copy of a Report on the Traffic working which shows that these strictures are not entirely undeserved.

5. In my despatch No.630 of the 3rd of July I requested that steps might be taken to select a candidate to fill the vacancy created by the resignation of Mr. T. H. Aikman. I am now given to understand that the provision made for this appointment is being utilized for the payment of the emoluments of Mr. T. Neilson, who as I reported in my Confidential despatch No.106 of the 5th of June,

has been appointed as Superintendent on probation of the Kampala - Port Bell Railway.

6. There is therefore no vacancy in the sanctioned staff, but nevertheless I trust that the request alluded to above may be allowed to stand. The conditions in the Protectorate change so rapidly that it is not always possible to foresee all requirements a year in advance and the report to which I have already referred has brought to light much that stands in urgent need of improvement. Moreover local traffic is now springing up at many wayside stations which in former days were entirely unremunerative, the public are quite reasonably beginning to demand a more punctual carriage of goods, and to meet these requisitions stricter supervision is essential. I ask therefore that one of the additional appointments may be approved at once and that provision for the other may be inserted in the Estimates for 1915-16. Funds can be found to defray the expenditure which will be incurred during the present year.


