## Instructions referred to on page I

If this Paper of Particulars and the Certificates councited with it, be not sent in original, the copies must be duly attested.

- Head I of Paper .- In the case of an Officer serving on the West Coast of Africa, a statement is to be added whether he is a native of that Coast. (Colonial Regulations, \$ 430).
- Head 3.—State the descript a of Allowance for which the Applicant is recommended, wit. Superamination Comprehation, Comprehation, Comprehation, Comprehation, Comprehation to their Pensions in respect of Parlessianal or other special qualifications, this should be stated, and a reference should be given to the authority under which the claim is made.
- Head 5. If the service has been interrupted by one or more breaks, the word "broken" should be added before or after the number of years and months, and the causes, dates, and circumstances of the break or breaks should be stated under heading 9.
- Medd 6.—If the Person retiring has been in receipt of the same Salary, or in the class from which he retires, for the 36 months immediately before the date of his retirement, the actual annual man of Salary or Wages at that date should be inserted, preceded by the word "actual." In other cases the average annual amount of Salary or Wages for the 36 months next preceding the date of retirement should be inserted, preceded by the word "average," but if the whole period of service is less than three years, then the average for the whole period of service should be inserted.
- Head 7.— A separate statement should be inserted of the average. Annual Value, for the 36 months immediately preceding retirement, of such Emplanent (exclusive of salary or wages) which is claimed to be included in the calculation of the Pension of Gratuity.

  Whenever the value of a House or House Allowance, so ascertained, exceeds one-sixth of the

salary and other emplaments which count for Pension purposes, it is to be reduced to one-sixth of that amount, so that it shall not exceed one-seventh of the whole.

- Fees which an Officer is allowed to retain for his own use will be taken into account for Pension purposes, with regular salary, at the annual average of the not receipts of the 35 months next proceeding the Officer's retirement.
