TELEGRAM:

THE Governor of the East Africa Protectorate  
Secretary of State for the Colonies.

(Received Colonial Office 7.15 p.m. 31st March, 1911)

No. 65 31st March Last June Rinderpest reported here in the East Africa Protectorate. Disease was marked by gastro-enteritis but was found to be inoculable. During September it was definitely located in North Kavirondo in this Protectorate. Uganda protectorate reported ~~that~~ Rinderpest at Mbale at the same time. Mbale outbreak now spreading over Eastern province of Uganda Protectorate. Early in February outbreak reported Nimule spreading very quickly with the loss of eighty per cent. Has since crossed Nile into Lado enclave. Presence of large herds ~~with~~ <sup>with</sup> game on Nile and shores of Lake Albert undoubted will lead to spread in a southerly direction even to North eastern Rhodesia.

I have therefore warned High Commissioner for South Africa of outbreak. At present ~~highlands~~ <sup>Highlands.</sup> East Africa Protectorate fairly clear. Ankole Unyore Toro, and Buganda assumed clear. Position very serious for us in 1890 ninety and 1897 it may spread over entire area then affected which involves loss of millions in money. <sup>We do</sup> I did inoculation as fast as possible in East Africa Protectorate now preparing 1000 doses serum in a week cost sixpence per dose as compared with half crown South Africa and India. Uganda Protectorate has appealed to us to help but our output serum totally inadequate even will barely meet (probable) requirements our own. Cattle Uganda Protectorate 450,000; if cattle disease spreads will involve loss of £700,000 at present rate of mortality <sup>(Gain)</sup> main wealth of natives. E.A.P. making zones immune cattle to prevent spread into Highlands native and European. Uganda Prot. wishes do same thing in interests of country but this affects materially general interests of S. Africa. Estimated cost of 30,000 doses serum required for Uganda Prot. which we would prepare £6000 administrative expenditure £2500 next financial year. This report and recommendation result of conference between self Jackson Imperial Veterinary Officers both Protectorates. Do you approve? Jackson proposes special taxation of cattle Uganda Prot. most cost of inoculation.

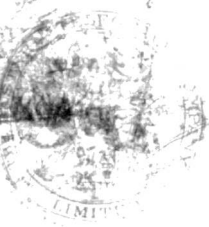
