Dear Mrs. /lexander,

I have great regret in reporting, that news reached Fort Hall on the 15th instant, that your husband was lying ill in his camp about eight miles from here. Porters were at once despatched, accompanied by the Sub-Assistant Surgeon to bring him into Fort Hall, with all the speed that wet and slippery roads would allow.

When I had an opportunity of examining Mr. Alexander, I saw at once that it was only a question of a few hours. He was suffering from a most acute attack of Blood-poisoning. He gradually sank into a comatose condition, and hassed quitally away at l.a.m. on the 16th of July 1914. Tr. Weeks the District Commissioner visited him at 7 p.m. on the 16th instant, the evening before he died, He was pleased to find Mr. Alexander free from pain.
