With reference to your despatch No. 606 of June 26th, I have the honour to inform you that the anticipated increase in traffic receipts was not realised owing to the drought and consequent failure of the crops. The cotton crop in Uganda was also unduly delayed.

2. The provision of £1,480 for Technical Education was not required because the technical examinations were postponed at the request of the Director of Public Works who reported that his engineers found the close of the financial year an inconvenient time for such examinations. These were therefore not held till April and May.
