This Ordinance has now been passed by the Legislative Council in the form approved by the Secretary of State for the Colonies and may be assented to without further reference home.

has been amended by the addition of the words "other than in a Protectorate" after the words "a British Court in a Foreign Country" in order to distinguish between British Courts in Protectorates, and British Courts in Poreign Countries other than Protectorates. Probates and Letters of Administration granted by British Courts in British Protectorates, which are legally Foreign Countries, are provided for by Section 2 of the Ordinance.
