## THE ETLD BIRDS PROTECTION AMENDMENT ORDINANCE 1914.

## MEMORANDUM.

This Ordinance was passed on the representation of the Game Department that some legislation was necessary to protect birds' eggs owing to the fact that in breeding centres such as Lake Naivasha undue destruction was carried on owing to wild birds' eggs being used largely as an article of food by humans.

- The Bast Africa Wild Birds Protection Ordinance
   1993 dealt with the protection of birds only.
- This Ordinance is based on the English Wild Birds Protection Act 1894.
- 4. The Ordinance in my opinion may be assented to before reference to the Secretary of State.
