MEMORANDUM.

Under the Trespass Ordinance 1913 the person making an arrest had no power to hand the arrested person over to a police officer. The Trespass Amendment Ordinance 1914 is designed to remedy that omission and gives the person arresting an offender under the Trespass Ordinance 1913 the same power to hand the offender over to a police officer as a private person arresting an offender for committing a cognizable offence has under the Criminal Procedure Code Section 59.

2. The power given is subject to an account of the circumstances under which the arrest was made being given in writing to the police officer to whom the offender is handed over.

3. The Ordinance may be assented to and published without prior reference to the Secretary of State.
