## THE RECISTRATION OF DOCUMENTS FURTHER AMENDMENT

## MEMORANDUM.

This is a short Ordinance to amend the Registration of Documents Amendment Ordinance 1914 to allow the acceptance of type written copies by the Registrar.

- 2. The Ordinance is the outcome of representations from the legal profession that the exclusion of a provision for type written copies in the Registration of Documents Amendment Ordinance 1914 Section 3 works some hardship owing to the scarcity of clerks who can engress and is the cause of additional expense to the public.
- 3. Such exclusion was intentional but owing to the fact that I am informed that indelible impressions can be made by typing the reason for the exclusion disappears if the Registrar has power to refuse registration in cases in which in his opinion the type written copy has not been produced by a process making an indelible impression.
- 4. The Registrar is given such power to Feruse registration in the case of type written copies not satisfying the requirements regarding permanency and also if the apper is of insufficient thickness in he durable.
- 5. The Ordinance may in my opinion be assented lewithout prior reference to the Secretary of State.
