I have the honour to refer to my despatch
No.520 of 26th May last in connection with the
staff of teachers provided for the European School
Nairobi and to invite your favourable consideration
of the immediate provision of an additional assistant—
master and a reorganisation of the staff on the
lines and for the reasons hereinafter stated.

- 2. On reseiving a report from the Director of Education that, in his opinion, an undue amount of work was devolving upon the present staff of the school owing to the additional duties necessitated by supervision of the boarding establishment, I appointed a committee of Medical Officers to inquire into the conditions under which the staff is at present working.
 - 3. As a result of the report of this committee, I propose at a later date to submit recommendations for the improvement of the school buildings and I have instructed the Director of Education to make provision in the forthcoming Estimates for an adequate staff for the school.

- In the meantime I would observe that part of the boarding establishment-that used for the elder boys of the school-is situate some two miles from the main building. The elder boys have their meals at the school and use the out-boarding house only for sleeping and for the preparation of their evening lessons. This arrangement means that the master in charge is fully engaged with the duties necessary to the care of a boarding establishment (e.g. general care of the building, issue of linen, laundry etc.) and must moreover be on duty from 6 p.m. to 10 p.m. every evening during term-time. He is therefore unable to share in the supervision duties in the school buildings and the work in consequence falls heavily upon the remainder of the staff.
 - 5. I was anxious to meet the situation by providing quarters for the elder boys more adjacent to the school, in order that the master in charge may share in the evening supervision duties of the school, but am unable to do so without incurring great and unnecessary expense. As, therefore, the services of one teacher are being lost to the school. I am of opinion that the excessive work at present placed on the staff can best be reduced by the appointment of an additional assistant master, for which I now ask your consideration.

A local candidate is available, whom I have instructed the Director of Education to engage subject to your approval. The salary of this master can for the remainder of the financial year be met from savings on the department.

. With reference to your despatch No. 648 of July 10th. 1914, the Director of Education is strengly in favour of the promotion of Mr. and Mrs. Humphries (lately appointed to the Central School, Eldoret, Uasin Gishu) to serve on the staff of the European School, Nairobi. I shall be unable for a considerable time to complete the buildings of the Central School and recommend that a new Headmaster and Headmistress be selected for this school and that Mr. Humphries be appointed in place of Mr. A. J. Pike and Mrs. Humphries as Headmistress in place of Miss Munro, the vacancy caused by whose retirement has not yet been filled. The Director of Education reports very favourably on the work of these two teachers who have been assisting at the Nairobi School pending the completion of the buildings at Eldoret and I therefore trust that this recommendation will receive your favourable consideration. With reference to their successors at Elderet the following names are suggested by Director of Education:

> Mr. and Mrs H. H. Demer, Sherborne School,

Gloucestershire.

I shall be obliged if consideration may be given to the claims of these teachers when the selection for the posts is being made.

- 7. Mr. E. R. Pratt, whose appointment as Acting Headmaster of the Arab School, Mombasa, was sanctioned in your despatch No. 587 of April 24th, 1914, has now been released by the arrival of Mr. Gaunt. Mr. Pratt has applied for permanent work in the Department and I therefore propose to retain him temporarily in order to fill vacancies caused by leave until I am able to submit for your approval an adequate staff for the European School Nairobi in connection with the next Estimates.
- 8. As the expenditure involved by these appointments can be fully met by savings on the departmental vote, I trust that my recommendations may be approved.
