It seems to me that anything found on a fugitive ought to be sent back in the condition in which it is found, as this might be very important from the point of view of evidence. If however the goods are found in ^{com}fold, it is unlikely that the ~~fold~~ ^{fold} itself can have any value of evidence except in the rather unlikely event of its being marked. Also goods may be marked in the past.

I should therefore be inclined to

bel that unless the sum was found in a draw in case it should be sent in the condition in which it is found. That if it is found in any form but that of a draft for local notes it should be insured to that the sum but will pay cost of insurance.
