Return 43540/3, which covers several cases of special expenditure due to the spending in 1913-14 of unexpended balance of offices belonging to 1912-13, is not available as the same is in the hands of the premier. 34586/3 is not available for the same reason (see p. 44 of the Return).

The return is quite straightforward in spite of its size which is due, no doubt, to the fact that this is the last return of the year. Mr. Wood's careful noting and arrangement of the relevant pp. has simplified the task of examination.
