Sir,

I have the honour to acknowledge the receipt of your despatch No. 438 of the 8th instant approving the grant of personal allowances of Rs. 15/- per mensem to Messrs. Martelli, Miller and Horns with effect from the 1st April last.

I regret that my recommendations with regard to the personal allowances were not exactly clear. The Manager asked that, as a recognition of their services, the above mentioned members of the staff might receive a personal allowance of Rs. 15/- per mensem and that these allowances should be given in annual increments of Rs. 15/- per mensem and spread over a period of three years. Thus this year they would receive Rs. 15/- per mensem increase, next year an additional Rs. 15/- per


per mensem thus making an increase of Rs. 30/- per mensem to their present salary and finally the year after next they would attain to the full increase of Rs. 45/- per mensem.

3. I do not consider that the Manager in his request is asking anything out of the ordinary and am satisfied that these officers are deserving of some special recognition especially in view of the fact that they have for some years been on the position of such grade. I trust that I have now made myself quite clear on the subject of these personal allowances and that you will be able to recommend them for favorable consideration by the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury.


