If the demand is made before reference is given to Capt Salkeld I do not see that he can be justly blamed. His responsibility is slight & the demand, a just reasonable doubt & leaves the allegation of pecuniary loss to the writer while his superior was there to give an account of the action Capt S. could be compelled to show just or valid specific explanation of his action because telling that the law be obeyed the money shall be recovered from him but that we stipulate that Mr Harcourt will give him an opportunity to establish the irregularity of a copy of the documents may I think be sent to him?

I beg to forward herewith a copy of a letter

2. This cheque was received in the ordinary course  
by the Treasury in May 1913, but, on presentation at the  
Bank, payment was refused as Mr. Bracepoli's account  
was closed. The cheque was thereupon returned to the  
District Commissioner with a letter from this office  
No. 38/16 of 19th May 1913.

3. I need scarcely point out the extreme irregularity  
on the part of the District Commissioner in retaining  
a dishonoured cheque as part of his cash balance, but  
apparently he did so under instructions from Capt. in  
Salkeld.

4. The cheque was cashed on Captain Salkeld's behalf  
responsibility, and the Treasurer suggests that he should  
be called upon to make good the amount.

Sir,

I have the honour to forward herewith attached cheque together with a copy of certain minutes relating to same.

2. The circumstances are these:

In May 1913 Captain Salkeld presented this cheque at the Local Treasury to be cashed. I cashed it and it was subsequently, when forwarded to the Treasury Officer, Mombasa, returned dishonoured. Since then it has been lying here in the local Treasury and although I have made repeated applications to Captain Salkeld to adjust this matter he has not yet done so.

3. Captain Salkeld states that it is a matter between Mr. Dracepoli, himself and the Treasurer. I do not follow this argument since I am virtually short in my cash to the extent of Rs. 695/- the amount represented by this cheque which is worthless, and were I called upon to hand over this station to anyone I should not be able to obtain from the taking over Officer a certificate of correctness.
