 I have the honor to request that you  
 will inform the Board that the  
 has had under the  
 the question of increasing  
 the initial salary of the  
 Headmaster of the "P"  
 School, no measure  
 for show provision is  
 made in p. 57 of the  
 approved estimate for  
 the current year.

2. In fact it has been found impossible to fill this post owing to the fact that the commencing salary is only £200.

It is essential that the post should be filled by a Messrs route.

The Director of the Post requests that

the aid, the increments of the post may be increased.

3. It is considered that, if a man of the proper type is to be appointed, £250 may by no means be

be acceptable as a 21 commencing salary, especially in the country therefore to ask for the approval of the substitution of salary at the rate of £250 rising to £300 by annual increments of £10 per annum at the rate of £200 rising to £300 by annual increments of £20 approved in the estimate.
