I spoke with you about this. It is possible but not probable that the Governor means that vacancies occurring as from now should not be filled. He means that the 12 vacancies now existing in the E.A.P. for which we have men at the T.S. course should not be filled. He would be told that it is impossible to meet his wishes, as these appointments are to all intents & purposes filled already.

He is quite right.

as soon as possible.

1 of these has already been
allocated to Somalia.

There are 2 vacancies in
Myanmar.

There will probably be 1
vacancy in Zanzibar.

There are 12 vacancies in the
E.A.P. -

After deducting the non-E.A.P.
vacancies, we are left with
11 men for the E.A.P. Mr
Bynes tells me that West
Africa would be prepared
to take a few extra men
and if necessary, we might
circumvent our own as to their
willingness to accept W. African
appointments but I much
doubt whether any would
consent.
