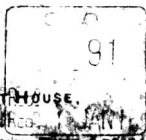

With reference to my despatch No. 869 of the 1st ultimo, have the honour to report that I have approved of the dismissal from the Police Force of 3rd Grade Constable Melanus with effect from the 12th instant.

Constable Melanus was tried by Field General Court Martial on the 12th instant and charged with the offences

1. of using violence to his superior officer
2. of wilful disobedience of a lawful command given him personally by his superior officer in the execution of his duty.

He was found guilty on both charges and sentenced

hard labour.
