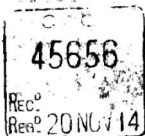

With reference to our letter of the 5th instant
graph, page 3, we enclose herewith drawing No.
which shows a typical arrangement of plant for a 1½
Station.

The drawing shows an accumulator room which
is required in the case of the five stations
under consideration.

The space taken by the plant for a 3 KW. station
is practically the same as that for a 1½ KW. station.

It will be noted that an horizontal engine is
shown on the drawing: if a vertical engine were adopted
it would probably be the case the length of the engine
room could be reduced by about 3 feet if it is considered
necessary, but it is desirable that ample space be allowed
in a station for use in the tropics.

5. The actual design of the buildings should be
decided by the Colonial Officers in order to meet local
conditions.
