CA rang up the other day to ask when
their payments should be made. In the
case of Mr. Goadwell £10 was paid
about 1 Nov? (an allowance for November)
and acc. to instructions contained in Govt
4080/14 the Dec? allowance was to be £4
and the allowance for subsequent months
£7. I told CA to pay Mr. Goadwell
the December allow of £4 at the beginning
of December, as we had paid the Nov?
allow at the beginning of November, and
Mr. Goadwell is already asking for more
(see G/4445/14). With regard to the others
I told CA to pay at the end of the month

in accordance with their usual practice, but they do not seem quite sure of this.

If paying Mrs Gradwell at the beginning of the month is going to cause confusion, we had better cancel the telephone instructions and tell them to make all payments at the end of the month, commencing with November, except in the case of Mrs Gradwell ^{and Mrs Watson} whose first bills will fall due at the end of Dec. in view of the £10 bills advanced in Nov. - (but Mrs Gradwell will probably write for money soon).

As we don't know when the deductions started we are rather in the dark, but seeing that we started this business with advances to women who were hard up it is useless to renew their hardships by a two month's gap or more. Therefore I would let Mrs Gradwell & Mrs Watson have their Dec allowance tomorrow. If the others have so far received nothing it is immaterial whether they are paid on 30 Nov or 1 Dec & we can put them all on the beginning of the month basis. If the others have been paid, I would continue to pay them at monthly intervals.
