In accordance with their usual practice, but

As we don't know when the deductions started
we are rather in the dark, but seeing that
he started this business with advances to
women who were hard up it is useless
to renew this hardship by a two months'
gap or more. Therefore I would let Dr^d
Bradwell & Mrs Watson have their back
allowance tomorrow. If the others have
so far received nothing it is important
whether they are paid on 30 Nov or 1 Dec.
If we can put them all on the beginning of
the month basis. If the others have been
paid, I would continue to pay monthly
at monthly intervals.


