Gentlemen,

I have the honour to acknowledge the receipt of your letter No. P.E.A.P.407 of the 9th instant and to inform you that I proceeded from Mombase to England by the all-see route as my steamship passage was booked to London by the Transury at Mairabd and not to Marseilles. On arrival at the latter port I was informed that the journey across France would, in all probability, entail some delay and considerable personal expense, and I, therefore, considered it/advisable to conform to the conditions under which my ticket was taken than to attempt a railway journey across the Continent. Mr. Read, who granted Captain Salkeld and myself an interview at the Celemial Office recently, recommended us to address your Department on the subject and at the same time stated that he thought that our leave would commence from the date of arrival in England as the question had been adjusted during the present state of war. I trust that, in the circumstances, this explanation will prove satisfactor
