I have the honour to transmit to you herewith copies of

Bosorandum in regard to Household Slavery in German Fast

Africa which has been submitted to the Scienatag by the

Secretary of State for the Colonies.

After explaining the history of the system and the present position of affairs in German hast Africa, the Hemorandum concludes with an expression of the opinion that it would not be desirable to abolish Rousehold Slavery at a given date, as had been suggested by the Reichstag, but that it would be preferable to let the system die a natural death by continuing the present policy, under which practically no new slaves are acquired and the children of slaves are regarded as free men, whilst a considerable number of slaves obtain their freedom every year. It is calculated that in this way the system of Household Slavery will almost entirely come to an ond by 1950.
